

COMMITTEES

- **Board of Trustees:** Governing body of the Fellowship. Meet second Tuesday of the month at 7 PM; first 30 minutes are open to members and friends for comments.
- **Endowment:** Manage investment accounts and decide appropriate uses for earnings. Support Fellowship members with small grants for HUUF related endeavors.
- **Finance:** Oversee and/or conduct budget development and monitoring, financial and cash management. Keeps Board of Trustees apprised of budgetary issues.
- **Tech:** Set up and monitor Zoom on Sundays and other events.
- **Children's Religious Education (RE):** The guiding force behind the various family-oriented events and Sunday morning offerings.



ENGAGEMENTS

- **Soul Matters:** Meet monthly in small groups to discuss the topic of the month, such as wisdom, mystery, generosity, and more.
- **HUUF for Black Lives Matter (BLM):** Hold one end of our BLM sign or bring a sign of your own to amplify our presence and support for this important and vital voice in our community and country. Every Saturday at 12 PM, on the corner of 4th & V in Eureka.

- **Ancient Forest Sangha:** A Buddhist community practice. More info at ancientforestsangha.org. Every Thursday at 7 PM.

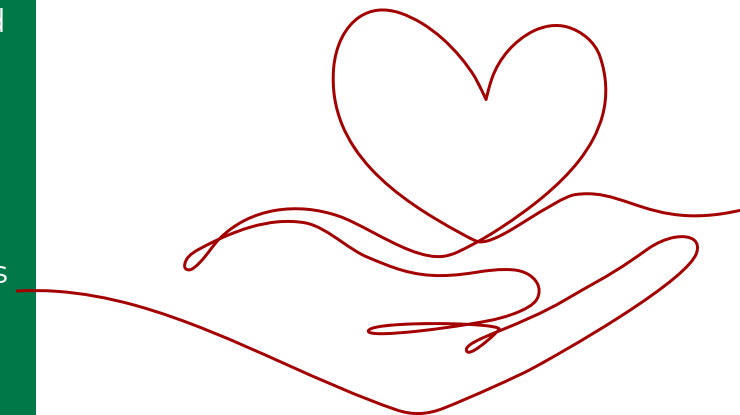

COMMITTEES

- **Membership:** Welcome and connect with visitors, orient new members, maintain membership information, plan/promote social and fundraising events.
- **Annual Activities:** Organize yearly events like the All Fellowship Summer Retreat, Silent Auction, and Halloween Festival.
- **Memorial Garden:** Maintain the permanent remembrance of beloved members who have passed, via names on the Memorial Stones and their bios in the Memorial Garden Book.
- **Grounds:** Plan and maintain the functioning and aesthetics of the grounds, lead regular volunteer work parties (planting, pruning, mulching, weeding).



- **Redwood Coast Covenant of the Unitarian Universalist Pagans (CUUPS):** Educate people about Paganism, promote interfaith dialogue, and help organize events.
- **Food & Fellowship:** Organize kitchen and pantry. Decide kitchen policies. Help organize food-involved events.
- **Building:** Maintain buildings and infrastructure. Do and/or coordinate periodic maintenance and work parties (wash windows, paint, pressure wash, etc.).
- **Aesthetics:** Arrange and hang art shows. Make decisions about furnishings, arrangement, bulletin boards, etc. within the buildings.
- **Climate Action Campaign:** Inform and educate the community on climate crisis issues that affect our local area and beyond. Look for actions that can mitigate and adapt to the effects of the climate crisis. Meet second Sunday of the month at 1 PM on Zoom.
- **OWL:** Organize and sustain Our Whole Lives, lifespan sexuality education workshops.
- **Worship Leaders:** Explore Sunday topics. Facilitate and plan all Sunday services. Meet first Saturday of the month at 9 AM.
- **Nominating:** Nominate individuals so that the membership of the Board of Trustees and each elected committee reflects the full diversity of HUUF.
